Background and Special Features

Postgraduate Year One (PGY1) residency programs build upon Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to develop pharmacist practitioners with knowledge, skills, and abilities as defined in the educational competency areas, goals, and objectives. Residents who successfully complete PGY1 residency programs will be skilled in diverse patient care, practice management, leadership, and education, and be prepared to provide patient care, seek board certification in pharmacotherapy (i.e., BCPS), and pursue advanced education and training opportunities including PGY2 residencies.

The PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program at Arkansas Children's Hospital in conjunction with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS) College of Pharmacy provides a structured educational training program in a pediatric environment, including participation in a Postgraduate Research Certificate Program and Teaching Certificate Program. Graduates will be prepared to practice as well-rounded pediatric clinical pharmacists, for clinical faculty positions, or for PGY2 pediatric residency programs.

Application Process

Eligibility

Applicants must possess a degree in pharmacy from an American Council on Pharmaceutical Education (ACPE) accredited college. The applicant must also be eligible for licensure in the state of Arkansas and a member of ASHP.

The ACH / UAMS College of Pharmacy PGY1 program participates in the ASHP Match. Applicants must submit the following documents to PhORCAS:

- Letter of intent
- Curriculum vitae
- Three (3) letters of recommendation
- Official transcript from pharmacy school
